

**IMPORTANT NOTICE TO REPUBLICAN PRIMARY
VOTERS IN SENATE DISTRICT 16:**

You are about to read something you will not find in Lisa Krasner's campaign mailers. You probably won't receive anything from Monica Stabbert, either. She doesn't have anywhere near the money Krasner does.

That means this letter may be the only unfiltered, honest look at this race you will get before you vote on June 9th.

You deserve the full picture. So please - read every word.

Dear Fellow Nevada Conservative,

I'm going to say something right up front that might surprise you.

I used to be in Nevada State Sen. **Lisa Krasner's** corner.

I supported her when she first ran for the Nevada State Assembly.

I believed in what **she said** she stood for.

I thought she was the kind of Republican this district needed.

I was wrong.

Not about the district. About her.

Over the years, I've watched Lisa Krasner go from someone who **talked a tough conservative game** on the campaign trail to someone who has become exactly what she said she'd never be...

A Carson City insider who **goes along to get along, votes with Democrats** when it's convenient, and collects the perks of seniority while the people who elected her get table scraps in return.

I don't say that lightly.

And I'm not going to waste your time with vague accusations.

I'm going to show you the evidence. Specific. Documented.

And frankly, **troubling**.

Then I'm going to tell you about **Monica Jaye Stabbert** - and why I believe she's exactly the kind of conservative this district now deserves.

First, Let's Talk About The District

Senate District 16 covers Carson City, Washoe County, and Storey County.

Republicans hold a **41,780 to 26,304** registration advantage over Democrats.

In 2022, Krasner won the general election by **20 points**.

So this seat is not at risk for Republicans.

It has never been at risk. A Republican could win this district in a bad year, a good year, or any year in between.

I want you to remember that as you read what follows.

Because every time an establishment Republican gets caught voting the wrong way or cozying up to the wrong people, their defenders say the same thing about challenging them in a primary:

"You'll cost us the seat!"

Not here. Not in District 16.

The Republican nominee - whoever it is - wins this seat in November.

Full stop.

That means voters in this primary have a luxury that most Republican voters in Clark County don't have.

You can demand a **real conservative** without worrying about handing the seat to a Democrat. You can afford to have **higher standards**.

The question isn't whether a Republican wins in November.

It's whether a better, more conservative Republican wins in November.

A Safe Seat Should Produce the Boldest Conservative - Not the Most Cautious One

There are Republican legislators in Nevada who represent genuinely competitive or Democrat-leaning districts.

They have to walk a tightrope every session. They have to think carefully about every vote.

I understand that. I don't always like it, but I understand it.

Lisa Krasner doesn't represent one of those districts.

With a 14-point registration advantage, she should be the **tip of the spear** for conservative issues in the Nevada Senate.

She should be the **loudest voice** for lower taxes, less government, election integrity, and parental rights.

She should be **taking risks** and **pushing the envelope** - because the voters in her district will have her back.

Instead, look at what she's chosen to champion during her years in the Legislature.

Her signature bills? Every single one of them passed unanimously.

That means **every Democrat** in the building **voted for them**, too.

Passing bills that every Democrat in the chamber votes for doesn't require any conservative backbone at all.

It doesn't cost you anything politically.

It doesn't advance the conservative agenda one inch.

It's safe. It doesn't rock any boats.

And it's exactly what you'd expect from someone who's gotten **very comfortable** lounging around Carson City.

Meanwhile, what about bills that actually matter to conservative voters?

Well, in 2025, Krasner introduced a bill to tighten Nevada's mail ballot deadline - a basic election integrity measure that conservatives have wanted for years.

But it never even got a hearing. Died without so much as a whimper. Not a peep of protest. Went out like a lamb, not a lion.

Proposing a bill is one thing. **Actually fighting for it** is something else entirely.

Krasner represents one of the safest Republican districts in the state.

And yet she's barely distinguishable from a Republican in a Democrat district who has to tiptoe around swing voters every day.

**She Supported and Voted for the “Hollywood Handout”
(And She Did It Twice!)**

In November 2025, Gov. Joe Lombardo called a special session of the Nevada Legislature.

The centerpiece was a proposal to hand \$1.8 billion in transferable tax credits to build a film studio in Las Vegas.

Conservatives across Nevada - and even some Democrats - called it exactly what it was: a **Hollywood Handout**.

The state's own nonpartisan fiscal analysts looked at the numbers and reported that the bill would cause Nevada's budget reserve to drop below the legally required minimum by 2030.

In plain English: the bill would **blow a hole** in the state budget that everyday Nevadans would eventually have to fill – meaning higher taxes for YOU.

That's not a conservative position. That's crony capitalism with a Nevada address.

Conservative activists from across northern Nevada **flooded Krasner's inbox** and social media **begging her to hold the line**.

One posted publicly:

"We know you are under enormous pressure to vote for this bill, but it's a bad deal. Doesn't even pay for itself, which is a pretty low bar. Hold the line - we will have your back."

But she didn't hold the line. She voted **YES** on the **Hollywood Handout**.

And here's what makes it worse.

This wasn't a surprise. It wasn't a moment of weakness under pressure from the governor's office.

It was completely consistent with how she had already been voting.

Back in the 2023 regular legislative session, **Krasner co-sponsored an earlier version** of this same type of film industry subsidy - working alongside Democrat sponsors to move it forward.

In fact, Krasner was **the ONLY Republican primary sponsor.**

That bill died. But she was already on record supporting the concept of handing special tax deals to “woke” movie studios.

So when the **Hollywood Handout** came roaring back in the special session two years later, her yes vote wasn't a lapse. **It was a pattern.**

Of all the legislators from outside southern Nevada - the part of the state that would have received virtually none of the economic benefits from this deal - only four voted yes.

Lisa Krasner was one of them.

The bill ultimately failed in the Senate. But not because of Lisa Krasner. *She did everything she could to pass it.*

And to this day, **she's never publicly explained** her vote to the conservative voters in her district who expected her to fight for them.

That silence tells you everything you need to know.

Then There's This

On May 1, 2026, the delegates of the **Nevada State AFL-CIO** gathered for their Committee on Political Education Conference.

The AFL-CIO is the most powerful **left-wing labor organization** in Nevada, representing over 150,000 union members.

They endorse candidates who vote their way - for government mandates, union power, and expanded government spending.

They fight against right-to-work laws.

They back candidates who want to grow government, not shrink it.

And Lisa Krasner is **the only Republican** on their 2026 primary endorsement list.

Not just in Senate races. On the **entire list**, spanning Assembly races, county offices, and statewide contests.

Every other Republican in Nevada was passed over. **Only Krasner** received their blessing.

The AFL-CIO does not make endorsement mistakes. They research their picks. They look at voting records, relationships, and behavior.

They endorse legislators who have given them reasons to believe they'll be sympathetic to their agenda.

Ask yourself: if you're a conservative Republican representing one of the safest Republican districts in northern Nevada, and the AFL-CIO picks you - **and ONLY you** - out of every Republican in the state, *what does that tell you?*

It tells you that the other side has noticed something. Something that conservative primary voters in District 16 should notice, too.

Now Let Me Tell You About Monica Jaye Stabbert

Monica is a longtime conservative political activist. Host of The Monica Jaye Show, she's been inducted into the broadcasting Hall of Fame.

She's spent decades in northern Nevada talking to real people about real issues - not angling for the next rung on a political ladder.

On the issues, **she doesn't speak in consultant-approved talking points**. She says what she means:

- **Border:** Secure the border. No excuses, no exceptions. Finish the wall. Stop the invasion. Period.
- **Spending:** Cut wasteful, non-essential spending. Your paycheck doesn't go as far as it used to. The Democrats' spending addiction is why. Time to cut it off.
- **School Choice:** Every Nevada child deserves a great education - not just the ones whose parents can afford the right zip code. The teachers union fights school choice because competition threatens their monopoly. Time to break it.
- **Voter ID:** If you need ID to buy a beer, you should need ID to vote. Require proof of citizenship. No exceptions. One *citizen*, one vote. Every illegal ballot cancels out a legal one.
- **Federal Land:** Nevada is 85% federally-controlled land. That's not a partnership - it's an occupation. Give Nevada back to Nevadans.

These aren't carefully hedged positions designed to offend as few people as possible. They're what **conservative Republican voters** in District 16 actually believe.

Monica has a 30-year track record of communicating conservative ideas **clearly, forcefully, and without apology**.

That is exactly what we need from a state senator in a district this safe. She doesn't need to water things down to win. She just needs to show up and **fight**.

Monica represents **exactly** the kind of conservative this district should be sending to Carson City.

Someone with deep roots in the community, a proven ability to communicate, America First values, and no reason in the world to play footsie with the AFL-CIO or hand out billion-dollar subsidies to woke Hollywood studios.

But Monica doesn't have lobbyist and insider money.

Krasner will spend heavily to keep her seat. Monica can't match her dollar-for-dollar.

I've been involved in conservative politics for a **long** time – including four years working in DC and another four in Carson City.

I've helped train and elect good Republicans - only to watch some of them drift to the mushy-middle once they get comfortable in the Legislature.

The drift follows a predictable pattern.

First, **they stop fighting** for the things they promised. Then they start voting with the other side on things they call "**reasonable**" or "**bipartisan.**"

Then they build enough relationships with **lobbyists** and **insiders** that it becomes harder to rock the boat than to go along.

And eventually they're getting endorsed by people **on the opposing team.**

When the seat is safe, the money keeps coming in, and the voters back home are too busy to pay attention.

Well, you're paying attention right now. That's why you're still reading.

District 16 Republicans have something most Nevada conservatives don't have: the freedom to choose.

You don't have to accept a Republican who gives you just enough to keep your vote while doing just enough for the other side to earn their endorsement.

You can elect someone who will walk into the Nevada Senate and **actually fight** on the issues that matter to conservative voters in Carson City, Reno, and Storey County.

You can elect Monica Jaye Stabbert.

Because it's not enough to simply elect **more** Republicans. Conservatives need to elect **better** ones, as well.

Before you vote, ask yourself these questions:
